



Introduction

 and decarbonization through increased awareness, supporting education on
 renewable energy for all. This thematic focus is greatly aligned with EDPR's
 business and therefore also promotes a more efficient use of the Company's
 skills, thus contributing to supporting communities in a more efficient manner.
- **Culture**: Contributes to the protection and promotion of cultural heritage, local traditions and access to culture and art, contributing to a more vibrant and creative society.

In parallel, and recognising the need to support projects that respond to other social needs of the communities where EDPR is present, the Company also invests in various topics such as health, social inclusion and response to emergency situations, among others.



EDPR celebrates the American Clean Power Week

2021 marked the first ever annual American Clean Power Week (ACPW), which is a nationwide celebration of clean energy and the industry's employment opportunities for Americans across all 50 states. The theme of this year's ACPW was "United States of Clean Energy".



The purpose of ACPW is to showcase clean energy technologies such as wind, solar, energy storage, and transmission infrastructure. ACPW celebrates these technologies which power American homes and businesses, create employment opportunities, invest in communities, reduce costs for consumers, and help the nation meet its 100 percent carbon-free power goal by 2035.

EDPR plays an essential role in creating a clean energy future, and therefore celebrated this year's ACPW with visits to its sites and creating a video featuring its employees on why they are proud to be a part of the renewable energy industry.

During the week, EDPR hosted a site visit at the Riverstart solar park in Indiana, which is the largest solar array (200 MW) in the state, and at the Rattlesnake Road and Wheat Field wind farms in Oregon. At the latter, the Company provided an educational tour to college students, educating them on clean energy technology and on the wind farm's Operation & Maintenance building, power generation, and grid connectivity. The students also learned more about the economic and environmental benefits of renewable energy production, turbine productivity technology, and wind technician climbing gear.

As a leader in the renewable energy sector, EDPR is glad to see the importance of renewable energy recognised and looks forward to supporting the ACPW initiatives next year and beyond.

EDPR celebrates the Chalmers Wind Farm Day

On Saturday, September 11, EDPR employees joined local public officials and community members in celebrating the annual Chalmers Wind Farm Day in Chalmers, Indiana.



The event brought attendees from neighbouring communities into downtown Chalmers for a day of festivities that included several activities such as an antique car show, a corn hole tournament, a 5k fun run, and a 20th anniversary remembrance of those who lost their lives on 9/11.

EDPR volunteers met with community members to answer questions about the wind farms surrounding Chalmers and to share experiences with local landowners who have leased land for wind turbines on their properties. The EDPR team also made and served fresh popcorn to attendees as a thank you for their continued support of renewable energy development in Indiana.

EDPR develops its Keep It Local program

As a leader in the renewable energy sector, EDPR is invested in paving the way for the industry of the future by supporting opportunities in local communities to pursue careers in the sector.



In this context, EDPR developed Keep it Local, a program that aims to mitigate rural depopulation through education and job training in the renewable energy sector. Specifically, the program seeks to promote education as a vehicle to fight against depopulation in rural areas, contribute to the development and training of students in areas of low population density, and facilitate access to the work environment by taking advantage of the development of its projects in rural areas, therefore contributing to covering the existing labour needs in these regions.

EDPR works with local schools, organizations and other stakeholders to identify existing opportunities for wind industry training and the areas with room for growth or increased support. The Company considers how projects intersect with the local communities and ways we could provide support such as funding scholarships for wind tech training, funding the development of training programs, offering EDPR facilities as sites for additional professional development, among others.

Currently, in Spain, the program is implemented in collaboration with Vestas and consists of offering 24 scholarships to take the Wind Farm Maintenance Technician course taught by the Asociación Empresarial Eólica (AEE).

EDPR is proud to support the development of the communities surrounding its sites, while increasing the visibility of wind energy as a potential career path and the opportunities provided for prospective wind workers.

EDPR reaches out to communities in need through Closer2You

Closer2You aims to improve the quality of life and ensure the wellbeing of the people who live in areas near our facilities essentially by improving the houses of underserved families, by providing funding to organizations focused on economic relief and by creating or renovating community spaces. The initiative was born in Spain in 2016 and it has reached a global magnitude since, having been implemented in most of the countries in which EDPR is present.







In 2021, EDPR brought its Closer2You program to Muxía in Galicia, Spain, specifically with the aim of fighting social exclusion and improving the quality of life of the local communities by renovating a home near a wind farm promoted by EDPR. Various works have been carried out in the house such as the comprehensive renovation of the electrical installation as well as the renovation of kitchen furniture and appliances. In addition, the evacuation and hot water network have been installed, the gas network has been renewed, all the carpentry on the main facade has been replaced and the walls and ceilings have been fully painted.







Also during 2021, EDPR implemented the Closer2You initiative to support the local communities in Greece by building a children's playground, by making electrical renovations in a school, by supporting health centres and donating computers and air conditioning equipment to the communities where it is present.





In addition, EDPR supported other initiatives such as building children's playgrounds in Italy, Romania and the United States, rebuilding of a school in Brazil, contributing to food banks in France and Colombia, and donating to Home Improvement Funds in Poland, Canada and the United States, among other contributions.

EDPR promotes Powering Culture

As a contributing member of the local community, EDPR seeks to enrich the general culture, supporting the creativity and development of the society, and seeks to support the most genuine traditions of the communities near its operations, valuing its local history.





Powering Culture consists in promoting culture and arts by supporting cultural projects mainly through sponsorships and donations. During 2021, EDPR implemented this initiative by supporting several culturally important and popular events, institutions and other opportunities throughout communities surrounding its sites.





EDPR supported local festivals such as the Bluesberry Festival in the United States and the Harvest Festival in Poland, a tradition that dates back to the 16th century with the purpose of celebrating the harvest and reward the reapers. The Company also supported local bands and music concerts, theatrical performances, cultural centres and museums, mainly throughout Poland, Romania and the US. EDPR also contributed to other culturally significant activities such as the event Festa San Mercurio in Italy, a donation to a library in Poland and to a theater in Italy, a contribution for Christmas lights in a local community in Colombia, and supporting the fair Feira do Queijo in Portugal.







EDPR celebrates its Green Education program

EDPR celebrated a new edition of its Green Education program, which aims to support the education of children from families with limited economic resources and also the operation of public schools, non-profit educational organizations and skills-building organizations meaningful among the local communities. This initiative encompasses both direct scholarships and investments in educational projects.







In 2021, EDPR launched new edition of the Green Education scholarships throughout local communities in Spain, Portugal and Romania, contributing with more than 70 thousand euros to students in need. The selection of the beneficiaries is made carefully considering criteria such as the student's academic record and the family's economic situation, and the scholarships are available for several educational levels such as elementary school, high school, university, and vocational training.







Throughout the year, the Company carried out several other activities within the Green Education program such as donating school supplies to students and schools throughout the US and in Greece; contributing to 4-H, one of the largest youth development programs in the US; donating to the Girl Scouts of Greater Chicago and Northwest Indiana, empowering them to be resilient leaders who make the world a better place; developing educational initiatives with children in Brazil to help boost their creativity and self-awareness; among others.

By developing this initiative, EDPR aims to help mitigate the educational gap of the most vulnerable groups and offer opportunities to the younger generations. We want to support the future development of the communities around us and reveal our commitment to education, society and the municipalities where we operate.

EDPR employees volunteer to help clean up local areas

EDPR is aware of the sensitivity of natural ecosystems and the pressures affecting biodiversity and, as a responsible company, it plays an active role in the conservation of wildlife surrounding its facilities.



In this context, more than 20 employees from EDPR's Madrid offices went to Villamanrique de Tajo to plant trees to mitigate the deterioration of the forests in the community of Madrid, Spain. This activity, which was implemented on a voluntary basis, was carried out together with Reforesta, a nature conservation NGO.



In the US, EDPR employees also volunteered with the Hermann Park Conservancy to help clean up and improve a local park. The Hermann Park Conservancy is a non-profit citizens' organization dedicated to the stewardship and improvement of Hermann Park in Houston. There are 455 acres in Hermann Park managed by the Conservancy, so there is a great need for volunteers to help with the maintenance and upkeep of the gardens and park. The team was provided with the tools and equipment for the day and everyone was ready to get their hands dirty and set about pulling weeds at the recently planted vegetation at the McGovern Centennial Gardens, which other volunteers originally planted.





EDPR protects local communities through Safe4Sure

As part of EDPR's commitment to contribute to the development of society and, specifically, its local communities, EDPR supports local emergency relief organizations such as first responders and fire departments in order to ensure our communities are safe and resilient for all, promoting the health and safety of the communities.



In 2021, we supported several voluntary fire departments in the US and in Poland, providing them with new resources to update their equipment and rescue tools, ensuring that the teams are equipped with the necessary lifesaving gear and have the funds needed to be ready for rapid relief in the event of a disaster.

EDPR, as a responsible company, is focused on listening to communities' safety needs and providing funding where local residents feel it is most needed. That is why we collaborate with local government organizations, non-profit entities and other stakeholders to identify areas where we can give needed support to ensure vital relief is available in times of crisis.

Employees volunteer to deliver meals to those in need

This July, some EDPR employees spent their morning volunteering at the Kids' Meals kitchen in Houston, Texas.



Kids' Meals is a non-profit organization that aims to end childhood hunger in Houston by delivering meals every weekday, year-round, directly to the homes of Houston's hungriest pre-school aged children. Countless families in Houston are facing increased food insecurity from the pandemic and many lack access to free school-based meal programs, which help support children during their critical development period.

The EDPR team put on their hats, gloves, hair nets, and beard nets and helped pack more than 800 bags of snacks for lunch sacks, which were delivered the following day to children across Houston.

Our employees are encouraged to actively participate in volunteering initiatives since they create an environment both within the Company and in the society that is more open to new ideas and supportive of individual differences. These volunteering activities, in addition to allowing employees to work together as a team, aim to have a significant and positive impact on people.

EDPR carried out Hurricane Ida Relief Efforts

On August 29, Category 4 Hurricane Ida made landfall in Louisiana. After Hurricane 💹 Katrina, Hurricane Ida was the second most damaging and intense hurricane to make landfall in the state. More than a million people in Louisiana lost power, heavy infrastructure damage was sustained, and substantive flooding occurred throughout coastal areas.



EDPR employees, particularly in Texas, are no strangers to hurricanes and were ready to help their Louisianan neighbours in their times of need.

EDPR employees came together by donating almost 2 thousand dollars to help support and feed Louisianans. These funds were contributed to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Greater New Orleans and Acadiana, a member of Feeding America, that serves the parishes and communities that were hard hit. Every \$1 raised by EDPR helped provide four meals to a family impacted by Hurricane Ida.



With this, EDPR has once again demonstrated the commitment of both the organisation and its employees to support local and affected communities in the event of disasters.



EDPR hosts the University Challenge for the 13th time

The EDPR University Challenge is an annual contest that seeks to stimulate the university community by giving students an opportunity to apply their academic knowledge to the development of a topic area or project in the fields of Engineering, Management, Economics, Marketing and Communication.





This is the thirteenth consecutive year that the EDPR University Challenge has been held, which was first promoted by the Company in Spain in 2009. Throughout its history, more than 1,850 students and 400 professors from more than 330 university centres have participated. Because of this, more than 800 innovative projects have been evaluated by an independent jury composed by university professors, EDPR employees and consulting specialists in the areas stipulated above.






